IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ASSOCIATION OF SOUTHEAST ASIAN NATIONS (ASEAN) AUTHORISED ECONOMIC OPERATOR (AEO) MUTUAL RECOGNITION ARRANGEMENT (MRA)

We would like to update that the Philippines is scheduled to implement the ASEAN AEO MRA (AAMRA) on 28 Feb 2025. The AAMRA became operational on 1 Aug 2024 for three ASEAN member states (AMS) – Brunei Darussalam, Malaysia¹ and Singapore; and subsequently on 19 Aug 2024 for Thailand² and 1 Oct 2024 for Indonesia. Under this MRA, companies certified under Singapore Customs' Secure Trade Partnership-Plus (STP-Plus) programme can benefit from facilitated clearance for their goods exported to Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and the Philippines. Likewise, companies accredited under these AMS' AEO programmes will enjoy similar facilitation on their goods exported to Singapore. The remaining four AMS (Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Viet Nam) are targeting to implement the AAMRA at a later date.
