

Risk Assessment

In 2016 there are about 246 export sites in Asia-Pacific



RISK LEVEL CRITERIA

HIGH

Local export license; or

Export license issued by foreign governments; or

Nuclear / military / aerospace, except Grid selling Balance of Plant for nuclear sites

MEDIUM

Screening issues identified; or

Located in a country with export control law, does NOT meet HIGH criteria, and exports or hand-carries commercial or repair/demo products or transmits/hand-carries technology

LOW

Located in a country with NO export control law


SCOPE & METHODOLOGY

Sites with export activities only

Export -

- 1. send products ("commodities, software and/or technology") to other countries
- 2. send products to other countries for repair or demo, or return repaired items to customers
- 3. hand carry product samples or engineering documents in hard copy or saved on laptops
- 4. send or download software and/or technology
- 10 simple questions; *GE Form*
- Training provided to export control focals
