IMPLEMENTATION OF THE UNITED STATES-SINGAPORE MUTUAL RECOGNITION ARRANGEMENT

As part of our continual efforts to enhance global supply chain security and facilitate the movement of legitimate goods, Singapore Customs signed a Mutual Recognition Arrangement (MRA) on Authorised Economic Operators (AEO) on 1 December 2014 with the United States Customs and Border Protection (US CBP). The MRA will be operational with effect from 1 February 2015.

2 Under this MRA, US CBP will recognise Singapore's Secure Trade Partnership-Plus (STP-Plus) companies as being of lower risk and thus facilitate the clearance of goods that are exported to or imported from these companies.

STP-Plus companies exporting to the United States

- Companies who have <u>previously</u> exported to the United States will already have a Manufacturer Identification Number (MID) with US CBP. For STP-Plus companies who export to the United States, your status as a STP-Plus company will be recognised when your business partner in the United States uses your MID number in the United States Importer Security Filing and/or Customs Entry.
- In the event you are not aware of your MID number, please contact your business partner in the United States to obtain the MID number assigned to your company.
- For <u>first-time</u> exporters to the United States, please contact your business partner(s) in the United States to create a MID number for use in the United States Importer Security Filing and/or Customs Entry.
- 6 All STP-Plus exporters should inform your Account Manager (from Singapore Customs) of the MID number assigned to your company. Singapore Customs will provide your company's MID number to the US CBP for the provision of MRA benefits.



Importing from United States C-TPAT companies

7 Singapore companies who are importing from a United States C-TPAT company can obtain the C-TPAT account number from your United States business partner and declare it in the TradeNet® import declaration as follows:

Processing Code 2 (PC 2)	C-TPAT account number
