ELECTRONIC SUBMISSION OF PREFERENTIAL CERTIFICATE OF ORIGIN FOR CLAIMING OF PREFERENTIAL TARIFF TREATMENT FOR GOODS IMPORTED UNDER THE VARIOUS FREE TRADE AGREEMENTS

From <u>1 April 2018</u>, an importer could choose to submit an electronic /scanned copy of the preferential certificate of origin (PCO) or self-certification to Singapore Customs instead of a physical copy for the purpose of claiming preferential treatment for the import of originating stout/porter, beer including ale, medicated samsu and other samsu from eligible Free Trade Agreement Partners.

2 The revised submission procedures are summarised in the following paragraphs.

Procedures for new mode of submission to claim preferential tariff treatment

With the new mode of submission, traders could scan and convert PCO or self-certification and supporting documents such as those illustrated in paragraph 4 to common image format such as PDF, JPEG, GIF, PNG, DOC, etc. The documents should then be e-mailed to the following email address:

customs_pref_doc@customs.gov.sg

- In order to help us process your submission expeditiously, please ensure that the following documents are attached in the email:
 - A scanned copy of the PCO or self-certification (depending on the Free Trade Agreement);
 - A scanned copy of the Inward Movement / Duty Payment Permit or indicate the Inward Movement / Duty Payment Permit number in the submission;
 - Commercial invoice; and
 - Bill of Lading.
- Singapore Customs would like to take this opportunity to remind importers who are importing originating stout/porter, beer including ale, medicated samsu and other samsu from eligible Free Trade Agreement Partners the importance of possessing the necessary supporting documentation and declaring the correct HS codes in the



Customs permits for the import to qualify for preferential tariff treatment, failing which the imports of such products will not qualify for preferential tariff treatment.

FAQs Annex A

1. What are some of the acceptable common image that I can convert my hardcopy PCO or Self-Certification?

Generally, Customs can accept common document types such as PDF, JPEG, GIF, PNG, DOC. The scan should contain the entire image of the CO or Self-Certification and should also be reasonably legible. Customs will reject illegible or truncated scanned copies.

2. Would I still need to submit hardcopy PCO or self-certification to Customs?

No. If you have submitted scanned copies of the said documents, you do not need to submit the original hardcopy unless it is requested to be produced during a post verification audit.

3. Do I still need to retain the hardcopy PCO or self-certification?

Yes. You are still required to maintain the hardcopy CO or self-certification in accordance to the document retention period listed in the various FTA. Customs may request for an original copy of the PCO or self-certification to be produced during a post verification audit.

4. How should I draft my email for claim of preferential tariff treatment?

There is no specific format but you may wish to consider the following format.

5. Can I still submit hardcopy CO or self-certification?
