CHANGES TO THE PROHIBITION OF EXPORTS, TRANSHIPMENTS AND GOODS IN TRANSIT

Under Regulation 6(1)(b) of the Regulation of Imports and Exports Regulations (RIER), the importation into, exportation from, transhipment in or transit through Singapore of any goods which will contravene the decisions of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) in resolutions made under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, are prohibited.

- With the adoption of UNSCR 2551 (2020), Singapore has updated the Seventh Schedule, read with regulation 6(2)(c) of the RIER to update the trade prohibitions imposed by the UNSC.
- 3 The updated prohibitions have been published in the **Regulation of Imports** and **Exports (Amendment) Regulations 2021**. These Regulations will take effect on 2 Aug 2021.

<u>Permit Applications for Items Exported to, Transhipped or Brought in Transit to Somalia through Singapore</u>

In conjunction with the adoption of UNSCR 2551 (2020) on Somalia, any export, transhipment, and transit of **nitroglycerin**, and **mixtures containing nitroglycerin¹** and technology required for the production or use of these items is thus prohibited under the Seventh Schedule, read with regulation 6(2)(c) of the RIFR
