OUTBREAK ON AVIAN INFLUENZA (AI) IN HIAURE, THE NETHERLANDS

The Netherlands reported outbreak of H7 low pathogenic avian influenza (LPAI) at a laying hen farm in Hiaure.

In view of the outbreak, AVA will impose a temporary restriction on the importation of poultry and poultry products to the 1 km radius restricted area around the affected premises in Hiaure with immediate effect. Heat-treated poultry products, which meet the requirements for heat inactivation of AI virus, will not be affected. For import from unaffected areas in the Netherlands, additional certification is required on the veterinary health certificate as listed on Annex 1.

Annex 1

The additional certification should state on the Veterinary Health Certificate:

- a) Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) and H5 and H7 low pathogenicity avian influenza (LPAI) are notifiable diseases in the country of export.
- b) The country has been free from highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) for the past three (3) months prior to export.
- c) The birds from which the meat was sourced were not vaccinated against H5 and H7 subtypes of avian influenza (AI), as defined by the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE).
- d) The poultry meat and meat products were not derived from birds originating from the 1 km radius restricted area around the affected premises.
- e) The poultry from which the meat was derived were born, raised, and slaughtered in the Netherlands, or were legally imported as day old chicks from countries with equivalent poultry health status.
