Commencement of Import Control Regime for Power-Assisted Bicycles (PABs) and Motorised Personal Mobility Devices (PMDs)

With effect from 28 June 2021, under the Small Motorised Vehicles (Safety) Act 2020 ("SMVA"), all importers of **Power-Assisted Bicycles (PABs) and motorised Personal Mobility Devices (PMDs)** will be required to obtain approval from the Land Transport Authority (LTA) before importing these devices into Singapore. This will apply to devices imported under Harmonised System (HS) codes 87116091 and 87116092.

- 2. The import control regime is a key upstream measure to stem the inflow of non-compliant PABs and motorised PMDs into Singapore. It reinforces the government's existing efforts to promote public path and fire safety in the use of active mobility devices.
- 3. Under the SMVA, it will be an offence to:
  - a. Import PABs and/or motorised PMDs without an import permit
  - b. Provide false or misleading information in an import permit application
  - c. Fail to comply with the conditions of an import approval
- 4. An individual who imports a PAB or motorised PMD without valid approval from LTA can be fined up to \$5,000, or face a jail term of up to 6 months, or both, if convicted for the first offence. Businesses can be fined up to \$10,000 for the first offence.
- 5. The import control regime will also apply to individuals bringing in PABs or motorised PMDs for personal use (e.g. residents returning to Singapore or travellers entering Singapore).

#### Scope of Import Control Regime

- 6. The following types of devices will be designated as <u>controlled goods</u>, and will require LTA's approval before importation:
  - a. All PABs (HS code 87116091):
  - b. All motorised PMDs (HS code 87116092), including:
    - i. those registrable under the Active Mobility Act 2017 ("AMA") e.g. electric scooters:
    - ii. those which are not registrable under the AMA e.g. electric unicycles, electric skateboards, hoverboards.

- 7. Completely knocked down (CKD) devices will not be subject to import control at this point. However, LTA may expand the import control regime to include them in future.
- 8. The following types of devices will <u>not</u> be controlled under LTA's import control regime:
  - a. Non-motorised PMDs or bicycles
  - b. Personal mobility aids (e.g. mobility scooters, motorised wheelchairs)
  - c. Motorised pedal cycles with three or more wheels
  - d. Electric motorcycles<sup>2</sup>

## Criteria for Import Approval

- 9. In general, LTA will only grant import approval for <u>compliant</u> PABs and motorised PMDs.<sup>3</sup> For <u>non-compliant</u> devices, LTA may grant approval under specific circumstances and subject to LTA's strict assessment, such as for:
  - a. Research
  - b. Re-export
  - c. Commercial or government use exclusively on private land or land with restricted public access
  - d. Military or national security use
- 10. Approval granted to import non-compliant devices may be subject to conditions imposed by LTA.

#### Applying for an Import Permit

11. To import PABs and/or motorised PMDs, importers must apply for an import permit and pay the permit fee via TradeNet.<sup>4</sup>

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> When applying for import approval, devices in this list should <u>not</u> be declared under HS codes 87116091 or 87116092. The exception is pocket motorcycles (see footnote 2). For enquiries regarding HS classification, you may submit an <u>enquiry</u> to Singapore Customs.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Some electric motorcycles, such as pocket motorcycles, may be classified under HS code 87116092. When applying for import approval, these should be declared under the product code "MISC", which is for goods not controlled by LTA. Refer to the <u>LTA website</u> for more information.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> "Compliant" refers to: (1) PABs that comply with technical requirements such as having a maximum unladen weight of 20kg, and not having a throttle or start-up assistance feature, among others. From 1 July 2021, PABs must also comply with the revised EN15194:2017 standard, and not the old EN15194:2009+A1:2011 standard; (2) PMDs that comply with the device criteria for use on public paths, i.e. maximum unladen weight of 20kg, maximum width of 70cm, maximum motorised device speed of 25km/h, and certification to the UL2272 fire safety standard. Refer to the LTA and OneMotoring websites for more information.

- 12. You will need to provide the appropriate HS codes, Product codes, and CA/SC codes (where applicable<sup>5</sup>) in your import permit application, and provide all necessary supporting documents. For details, please refer to the LTA website at the following link: https://go.gov.sg/pmdimport.
- 13. Importers and declaring agents should also take note of the following processes and timelines:

Compliant Devices	LTA will take <b>up to three working days</b> to process the import permit application submitted via TradeNet (after all necessary supporting documents have been submitted). Importers are advised to obtain the permit before the goods arrive, to avoid delays.
Non- compliant Devices	For non-compliant devices, there are <b>two stages</b> of application. Importers are required to first obtain <b>in-principle approval</b> from LTA via email, then apply for the import permit via TradeNet.  1. The request for in-principle approval should be sent to LTA at LTA import amdevice@lta.gov.sg, complete with all necessary supporting documents, <b>at least six weeks</b> before the date of importation.  2. LTA will take <b>up to three working days</b> to process the import permit application via TradeNet (after all necessary supporting documents, including the letter of in-principle approval from LTA, have been submitted). Importers are advised to obtain the permit before the goods arrive, to avoid delays.

- 14. The following fees are applicable for import permits for PABs and motorised PMDs:
  - a. Compliant devices \$30 per device
  - b. Non-compliant devices \$90 per device

### Import Permits Approved Before 28 June 2021

15. If you have an import permit for PABs or motorised PMDs <u>approved before</u> 28 June 2021, but the devices will only be imported <u>on or after</u> 28 June 2021, you will be allowed to use the prior-approved import permit for as long as it is valid, but **no later than 27 July 2021**. Please seek a letter of approval from LTA at <u>LTA import amdevice@lta.gov.sg</u> to use your prior-approved permit on or after 28 June 2021. Please also take note of the validity period of your import permit and extend it via TradeNet before it expires, if necessary.

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> When applying to import <u>non-compliant devices</u>, you will have to fill in the "CA/SC Code 1" field to declare the purpose of import.

16. If your devices will only be imported <u>after 27 July 2021</u>, you will not be able to use an import permit approved before 28 June 2021. Please apply for a new import permit via TradeNet.
