Singapore Customs detains over 1,300 suspected trademark-infringing wallets, purses and bags

Singapore Customs has detained more than 1,300 pieces of suspected trademark-infringing goods from a shipment that was imported from China to Singapore.

During an inspection of a container at the Tanjong Pagar Distripark on 2 September 2016, Singapore Customs officers found an assortment of wallets, purses and bags suspected to be counterfeit goods of various popular brands. Singapore Customs alerted the Singapore Police Force who then seized the items for further investigations.

Singapore Customs does not condone such illegal trading activities and will take firm action against importers of counterfeit goods to ensure a robust intellectual property rights enforcement regime in Singapore.
