9,188 bottles of duty-unpaid liquor seized and four men arrested in operation

Singapore Customs seized 9,188 bottles of duty-unpaid liquor and arrested four men on 18 April 2019 for their involvement in duty-unpaid liquor activities.

That afternoon, Singapore Customs officers conducted an operation in a unit of an industrial building in Woodlands Close. Suspecting that a consignment of goods in the unit contained duty-unpaid liquor, the officers moved into the unit for a check.

Four men, all Chinese nationals, who were unpacking more than 630 boxes containing bottles of duty-unpaid liquor, were arrested. Investigations revealed that the duty-unpaid liquor were smuggled into Singapore from China. The boxes were labelled as soy sauce, in an attempt to conceal the duty-unpaid liquor.

Court proceedings against one of the men are ongoing, while investigations are ongoing for the other three men.

A total of 9,188 bottles of duty-unpaid liquor were seized in this operation. The total duty and Goods and Services Tax (GST) evaded amounted to about \$186,480 and \$17,830 respectively.

"Singapore Customs will continue to clamp down on the smuggling and distribution of duty-unpaid liquor," said Assistant Director-General (Intelligence & Investigation) Yeo

Sew Meng [新加坡关税局助理局长(情报与调查)杨秀明]. "We will spare no effort in going after sellers as well as buyers of duty-unpaid liquor."

Buying, selling, conveying, delivering, storing, keeping, having in possession or dealing with duty-unpaid goods are serious offences under the Customs Act and the GST Act. Offenders can be fined up to 40 times the amount of duty and GST evaded and/or jailed for up to six years. Vehicles used in the commission of such offences are also liable to be forfeited.
