## Singapore Customs arrests a Singaporean man and seizes over 379 cartons of duty-unpaid cigarettes

Singapore Customs arrested a 54-year-old Singaporean man and seized over 379 cartons duty-unpaid cigarettes in an operation conducted in the vicinity of Yishun Street 51 on 13 May 2020.

During the operation, Singapore Customs officers observed the man pushing a trolley loaded with boxes wrapped in black trash bags into a HDB unit located along Yishun Street 51. The officers subsequently searched the unit and uncovered 379 cartons and one packet of duty-unpaid cigarettes and arrested the man.

The duty-unpaid cigarettes and cash amounting to SGD\$620, suspected to be proceeds of sales of duty-unpaid cigarettes, were seized. The duty and Goods and Services Tax (GST) evaded amounted to about \$51,800 and \$3,910 respectively.

Investigations revealed that the man had bought the duty-unpaid cigarettes from an unknown man and had intended to sell them for a profit. The man was charged in court on 15 May 2020 and court proceedings are ongoing.

Buying, selling, conveying, delivering, storing, keeping, having in possession or dealing with duty-unpaid goods are serious offences under the Customs Act and the GST Act. Offenders can be fined up to 40 times the amount of duty and GST evaded and/or jailed for up to six years. Vehicles used in the commission of such offences are also liable to be forfeited.
